

32nd TOUQUET CLASSIC AMATEUR ADDITIONAL LOCAL RULES

These local rules supersede all other local rules for the duration of the competition.

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (R18.2)

- The boundary edge of the course is defined by the course-side points of the posts of the electrified fence, which is a boundary object. A ball is out of bounds if all of the ball is outside the boundary edge.

2. MOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 15.2)

- Ropes and stakes.

3. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 16.1)

- Artificially surfaced roads and their reasonable extensions and honeycomb structures placed on the ground.

4. ANORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (Rule 16.1)

- For any animal damage, interference does not exist is damage only interferes with the player's stance
- Stone-filled drains
- Differences in height due to the automatic watering system.
- Gullies in bunkers.
- NO PLAY ZONE: Mer Course Hole 1 and 13 "with blue stakes and green tops" (see display)

5. EMBEDDED BALL (Rule 16.3) in the general area.

Exception: A player may not take free relief if the ball is embedded in sand, in an area not cut to fairway height or less or is embedded in the face of a bunker that consists of stacked turf.

6. Ready Play" should be applied. (2018)

MISCELLANEOUS REMINDERS

Interruption of play

<u>Due to a dangerous situation</u>	One prolonged sound of a siren	Discontinue Play Immediately and go to the clubhouse.
Normal suspension	3 consecutive short sounds of a siren, repeated	Discontinue Play and PSE stay on the course
Resumption of play	2 short notes of a siren, repeated.	Please Play quickly

Result of a Competition – Competition closed

The result of the competition is final when the results have been officially announced.

Pace of play → Delay at the Recording Desk

The Tournament Committee determines the maximum time allowed for the stipulated round. All groups have to complete the stipulated round within this time. It is the player's responsibility to respect this maximum time allowed (R.5-6).

If you are ready → play (if you can without danger to another player). Even if it is not your turn. Under no circumstances you should look for the ball for more than 3 minutes. Do not help another player search for a ball until after you have played your next stroke. Stay on the same hole as the flight in front and always play a provisional ball if your ball is likely to be lost elsewhere than in the Penalty Area.

Doubt about the procedure:

If in doubt as to procedure, the player may play a second ball R 20.1c (3). Before playing you must choose the ball you want to count. Regardless of the score, he **must** report the facts to the Committee or he will be disqualified.
